From the Director

National Library Week is April 6-12 and this year’s theme is “Drawn to the Library!” Millions of people across the country visit their libraries every week, so this year’s theme is very appropriate. Whatever draws you to our Library, we are looking forward to seeing you! The first National Library Week was observed in 1958 with the theme “Wake Up and Read!” The 2025 celebration marks the 67th anniversary of this first event. Libraries have undergone significant changes over the last 60 years, evolving in response to technological advancements, societal shifts, and changing expectations of public spaces with the desire for study rooms and a wide variety of programs. Technology plays a big role in our world today, and in this newsletter we are hosting two programs to help build your skills: TechWise Computer Course and our own Tech Cafe.

The installation of the mural for our Screened Porch Room is underway and should be completed by the beginning of March. It will be fun to find the pieces we made that Artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene will incorporate into the finished piece.

April 1 is the Consolidated Election. We have three Trustees up for re-election and one new Trustee running, with four seats to fill. Our returning Trustees are Ian Chafee, Christine Barry, and Kathleen Groark. Our new Trustee is Malgorzata (Maggie) Klich. 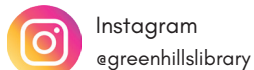

History Archive

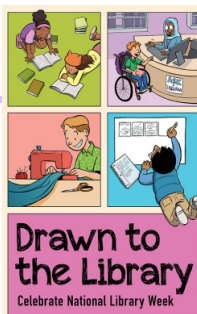
